Welcome to the Robert H. Smith School of Business MBA Program. You are taking the first steps in what will be a life-changing adventure.

The adventure comes with a challenge though. The first semester of the program can be difficult, especially if your quantitative skills have become rusty.

To help you make the transition back to school the Smith School faculty have selected four online "pre-skills" courses from Harvard Business School Publishing: *Financial Accounting*, *Spreadsheet Modeling: Excel 2013, Quantitative Methods*, and *Finance*. The material covered in these online pre-skills courses is used in three Smith School core courses in the Fall semester of the first year: *Financial Accounting, Data, Models and Decisions* (or DMD), and *Financial Management*. Your performance in each pre-skills course will contribute in part to your grade in the corresponding Smith School core course. In the following pages, you will find registration instructions as well as details on each pre-skills course.

The pre-skills courses share a common objective, which is to equip you with basic quantitative concepts, so that the subsequent Smith School courses can be conducted at a "higher level" (focusing on managerial implications instead of getting stuck in the quantitative details). Some of the topics covered in the pre-skills courses will be re-visited in the Smith School courses; your prior familiarity with these topics will be crucial in eventually developing mastery in these areas.

All pre-skills courses must be completed by **6:00PM on Sunday, August 13, 2017.** The accompanying letters from each faculty member provide estimated time needed to complete each pre-skills course. However, please note that (1) the actual time required to complete a course will depend on your prior background in that area, and (2) many students significantly underestimate the time required to complete these courses, especially *Quantitative Methods*.

I hope you have a wonderful summer. I look forward to meeting you in person in August.
